


MOSES DIES AND JOSHUA BECOMES LEADER (Deuteronomy 31-34, Joshua 1:1-9)



The Bible says that Moses gathered all the Israelites. He said, "God has told me I will not cross the River Jordan and enter the Promised Land. But God has chosen Joshua to be your new leader."

Moses told Joshua, "Be strong and courageous! You will lead these people into the Promised Land. You will help them fight the nations that live there. Conquer the nations and make the land your new home. Don't be afraid, for the Lord will be with you. He will never fail you or leave you."





Moses then wrote out God's laws and gave the scrolls to the priests. He told them take care of the scrolls and teach the laws to the people. Everyone came together to hear God's laws read aloud. Moses urged them to obey God with love and reverence.

God told Moses and Joshua to meet Him in the tabernacle. He appeared to them both in a great cloud. God explained that Moses would die soon. He asked Moses to write down a song and teach it to all the people.
