
People in Nazareth had heard that he was a great Teacher and could even do miracles. They thought that maybe he would do a miracle in Nazareth.




Elijah helped a widow who wasn't a Jew.





Elisha healed Naaman who wasn't a Jew.




The people listening in the synagogue became angry. They wanted the Jews to be God's only special people.

They forced Jesus out of town. They tried to push Jesus off of a cliff!






Jesus is the promised Messiah!
