

Lesson 1: ISRAEL DEMANDS A KING (1st Samuel 8-10)



The Bible says that Samuel was the last Judge over Israel. Samuel loved God and always tried to do what was right.

When he was old, Samuel appointed his sons Joel and Abijah to be judges, but they did not obey God. They weren't fair or kind to the people.

The people of Israel decided that they wanted to have a king. They told Samuel, "We want a king! We want to be like the nations around us."





Samuel felt bad that they didn't want him to lead them anymore. So, Samuel prayed to God. God told Samuel, "The people aren't rejecting you, Samuel. They are rejecting me as their King. Give them what they want. But be sure to warn them what it will be like to have an earthly king."

Samuel explained to the Israelites, "A King can make your sons fight in the army. He can make your daughters work for him. He can take away your fields and servants. You will be sorry you wanted a king."

But the Israelites didn't care. "Give us a king!" they said.


